Isaiah 24

Judgment on the whole earth

Behold, the LORD will empty the earth and make it desolate, and he will twist its surface and scatter its inhabitants.

- ² And it shall be, as with the people, so with the priest; as with the slave, so with his master; as with the maid, so with her mistress;
- as with the buyer, so with the seller; as with the lender, so with the borrower; as with the creditor, so with the debtor.
- ³ The earth shall be utterly empty and utterly plundered; for the LORD has spoken this word.
- ⁴ The earth mourns and withers; the world languishes and withers; the highest people of the earth languish.
- ⁵ The earth lies defiled under its inhabitants:

for they have transgressed the laws,

violated the statutes,

broken the everlasting covenant.

- ⁶ Therefore a curse devours the earth, and its inhabitants suffer for their guilt;
- therefore the inhabitants of the earth are scorched, and few men are left.
- ⁷ The wine mourns,

the vine languishes,

all the merry-hearted sigh.

- ⁸ The mirth of the tambourines is stilled, the noise of the jubilant has ceased, the mirth of the lyre is stilled.
- ⁹ No more do they drink wine with singing; strong drink is bitter to those who drink it.
- ¹⁰ The wasted city is broken down;
- every house is shut up so that none can enter.

 11 There is an outcry in the streets for lack of wine;
- all joy has grown dark; the gladness of the earth is banished.
- ¹² Desolation is left in the city;
 - the gates are battered into ruins.
- ¹³ For thus it shall be in the midst of the earth among the nations,
- as when an olive tree is beaten, as at the gleaning when the grape harvest is done.

¹⁴ They lift up their voices, they sing for joy; over the majesty of the LORD they shout from the west.

¹⁵ Therefore in the east give glory to the LORD; in the coastlands of the sea, give glory to the name of the LORD, the God of Israel.

¹⁶ From the ends of the earth we hear songs of praise,

of glory to the Righteous One.

But I say, "I waste away,

I waste away. Woe is me!

For the traitors have betrayed,

with betrayal the traitors have betrayed."

¹⁷ Terror and the pit and the snare are upon you, O inhabitant of the earth!

¹⁸ He who flees at the sound of the terror shall fall into the pit,

and he who climbs out of the pit shall be caught in the snare.

For the windows of heaven are opened, and the foundations of the earth tremble.

¹⁹ The earth is utterly broken, the earth is split apart, the earth is violently shaken.

²⁰ The earth staggers like a drunken man; it sways like a hut;

its transgression lies heavy upon it, and it falls, and will not rise again.

²¹ On that day the LORD will punish the host of heaven, in heaven, and the kings of the earth, on the earth.

²² They will be gathered together as prisoners in a pit;

they will be shut up in a prison,

and after many days they will be punished.

²³ Then the moon will be confounded and the sun ashamed,

for the LORD of hosts reigns on Mount Zion and in Jerusalem, and his glory will be before his elders.

Isaiah 25

God will swallow up death forever

O LORD, you are my God; I will exalt you; I will praise your name, for you have done wonderful things,

plans formed of old, faithful and sure.

² For you have made the city a heap, the fortified city a ruin;

the foreigners' palace is a city no more;

it will never be rebuilt.

³ Therefore strong peoples will glorify you; cities of ruthless nations will fear you.

⁴ For you have been a stronghold to the poor, a stronghold to the needy in his distress,

a shelter from the storm and a shade from the heat:

for the breath of the ruthless is like a storm against a wall,

⁵ like heat in a dry place.

You subdue the noise of the foreigners;

as heat by the shade of a cloud,

so the song of the ruthless is put down.

⁶ On this mountain the LORD of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wine, of rich food full of marrow, of aged wine well refined.

⁷ And he will swallow up on this mountain the covering that is cast over all peoples, the veil that is spread over all nations.

⁸ He will swallow up death forever;

and the Lord GOD will wipe away tears from all faces,

and the reproach of his people he will take away from all the earth,

for the LORD has spoken. ⁹ It will be said on that day.

"Behold, this is our God; we have waited for him, that he might save us.

This is the LORD; we have waited for him;

let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation."

¹⁰ For the hand of the LORD will rest on this mountain, and Moab shall be trampled down in his place, as straw is trampled down in a dunghill.

And he will spread out his hands in the midst of it as a swimmer spreads his hands out to swim,

but the LORD will lay low his pompous pride together with the skill of his hands.

¹² And the high fortifications of his walls he will bring down, lay low, and cast to the ground, to the dust.

Cross References

Jeremiah 4 v 23 to 26:

I looked at the earth, and it was formless and empty; and at the heavens, and their light was gone.

24 I looked at the mountains, and they were quaking; all the hills were swaying.

25 I looked, and there were no people; every bird in the sky had flown away.

26 I looked, and the fruitful land was a desert; all its towns lay in ruins before the LORD, before his fierce anger.

Revelation 9 v 15:

¹⁵ And the four angels who had been kept ready for this very hour and day and month and year were released to kill a third of mankind.

Revelation 8 v 7 to 12:

⁷ The first angel sounded his trumpet, and there came hail and fire mixed with blood, and it was hurled down on the earth. A third of the earth was burned up, a third of the trees were burned up, and all the green grass was burned up. ⁸ The second angel sounded his trumpet, and something like a huge mountain, all ablaze, was thrown into the sea. A third of the sea turned into blood, ⁹ a third of the living creatures in the sea died, and a third of the ships were destroyed. ¹⁰ The third angel sounded his trumpet, and a great star, blazing like a torch, fell from the sky on a third of the rivers and on the springs of water— ¹¹ the name of the star is Wormwood. A third of the waters turned bitter, and many people died from the waters that had become bitter. ¹² The fourth angel sounded his trumpet, and a third of the sun was struck, a third of the moon, and a third of the stars, so that a third of them turned dark. A third of the day was without light, and also a third of the night.

Genesis 9 v 16: "Whenever the rainbow appears in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and all living creatures of every kind on the earth."

Genesis 17 v 7: "I will establish my covenant as an everlasting covenant between me and you and your descendants after you for the generations to come, to be your God and the God of your descendants after you."

Leviticus 24 v 8: This bread is to be set out before the LORD regularly, Sabbath after Sabbath, on behalf of the Israelites, as a lasting covenant.

2 Samuel 23 v 5:

"If my house were not right with God, surely he would not have made with me an everlasting covenant, arranged and secured in every part; surely he would not bring to fruition my salvation and grant me my every desire.

Jeremiah 32 v 40: "I will make an everlasting covenant with them: I will never stop doing good to them, and I will inspire them to fear me, so that they will never turn away from me."

Hebrews 13 v 20: Now may the God of peace, who through the blood of the eternal covenant brought back from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep...

Matthew 24 v 38: "For in the days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day Noah entered the ark..."

Revelation 7 v 9, 10, 13, 14: ⁹ After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. ¹⁰ And they cried out in a loud voice:

"Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb."

¹³ Then one of the elders asked me, "These in white robes—who are they, and where did they come from?" ¹⁴ I answered, "Sir, you know." And he said, "These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

Isaiah 53 v 5:

But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed.

Revelation 6 v 13, 14: ¹³ and the stars in the sky fell to earth, as figs drop from a fig tree when shaken by a strong wind. ¹⁴ The heavens receded like a scroll being rolled up, and every mountain and island was removed from its place.

Jude 6: And the angels who did not keep their positions of authority but abandoned their proper dwelling—these he has kept in darkness, bound with everlasting chains for judgment on the great Day.

Revelation 20 v 10: And the devil, who deceived them, was thrown into the lake of burning sulfur, where the beast and the false prophet had been thrown. They will be tormented day and night for ever and ever.

Revelation 19 v 9: Then the angel said to me, "Write this: Blessed are those who are invited to the wedding supper of the Lamb!" And he added, "These are the true words of God."

2 Corinthians 3 v 15, 16: ¹⁵ Even to this day when Moses is read, a veil covers their hearts. ¹⁶ But whenever anyone turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away.

Genesis 2 v 16, 17: And the LORD God commanded the man, "You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; ¹⁷ but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat from it you will certainly die."

2 Timothy 1 v 10: but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Saviour, Christ Jesus, who has destroyed death and has brought life and immortality to light through the gospel

1 Corinthians 15 v 54: When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory."
