My parents' trip to Southern Greenland

Letter from my father to me, from Manby House, dated 29 July 1983:

My Dear Adrian

We are all sweltering in one of the hottest summers we can remember. The whole of July has been really marvellous – too hot, many people think – but of course we missed the first half of it while away in Greenland. Even there, though, it was pleasantly warm and, on most days, beautifully sunny.

It was really a 'fabulous' holiday – such wonderful scenery, masses of glorious icebergs, blue, green, white and translucent; and the ruins of the Norse homesteads, byres, churches etc. (including those of Eric the Red, the first settler in AD 982) were most evocative.

We walked for miles and miles through country very reminiscent of the Scottish highlands (though with snow on the mountains, and the great ice-cap behind); we climbed mountains, and we fished in marvellously crystal-clear rivers and lakes.

We caught Artic char (a kind of trout, but pink underneath), but most of them were too small to keep. I caught the three largest – using a spinner – but we only kept two of these.

We missed the ship from Reykjavik by one hour, so had to spend a day there and catch a flight from Keflavik to Glasgow on 15th – but were very well looked after and accommodated for 2 nights by the Icelandic Hydrographer and his wife (Gunnar Bergsteinsson and Brynja Thorarinsdotter) whom we knew of old.

Since getting back here late that night we've hardly stopped to draw breath, catching up with ourselves, so to speak...
